[Hohenfels Military Pay News: What to expect when you PCS](#)

Your PCS orders are on their way and so are you! Before you go review your LES for leave balance, COLA, and any outstanding debts. The Housing office authorizes any TLA. If not staying in base lodging you need a statement of non availability for lodging costs. When you out-process finance, bring a prepaid hotel receipt, zero balance. We will process your claim on your departure date. PCS entitlements are: Intransit BAH, starts the day you depart and continues through arrival to new CONUS duty station (inclusive of all leave and TDY dates). COLA stops at midnight the day prior to your departure as well as any OHA. Advance Pay is available 30 days prior to departure thru 60 days after arrival to the new PDS. DLA advances are no longer available but paid in full at the gaining PDS. For DLA, GTCC use, and all PCS travel rules see JTR chapter 5: <http://www.defensetravel.dod.mil/Docs/perdiem/JTR.pdf>. What about receipts? Unless you use Gov't transportation your POV mileage, train, taxi or bus is reimbursable with receipts; rental vehicle is NOT reimbursable. You and each family member will receive a flat rate per diem for travel days; you do not need food and lodging receipts. If stated on your orders excess baggage is payable with a receipt; pets are not. If flying commercial you must have IBA on your orders. Remember, your pay is your responsibility. [Germany vehicle registry fee hikes due Oct. 1](#)

Oct. 1: The USAREUR Registry of Motor Vehicles is increasing the vehicle registration fee in Germany by \$5 to \$35 dollars. Driver license fees are also going up to \$20. Licensing fees were last increased in 1986 and the registration fee was raised to \$30 in 2006 to fund the change to German license plates. The increase is necessary because the costs for personnel, supplies, data processing and equipment have continually grown over the years. The registry is a supplementary mission non-appropriated fund entity based in Sembach, Germany. The fund does not generate profits but must recover operational costs and maintain fund solvency. The fund has sustained losses for the past three years and can no longer absorb the losses without increasing fees.

Protection Perspective

Don't Scan Your CAC!

CAC Scan, a free application for Android devices, was recently released on Google Play. With it, users could scan the barcode on the front of Common Access Cards (CAC), which contain some personally identifiable information (PII) such as the name, social security number, rank, and DoD ID number of the CAC cardholder. DO NOT download or use any application designed to read the barcode, magnetic strip, or integrated circuit chip on your CAC. The application could be sending your PII to people you don't want to send your PII to! Neither CAC Scan nor any other CAC reader application available for download via an app store are sponsored or endorsed by the Department of the Army.

General Tips about Mobile Apps:

Before downloading, installing or using any application, take a moment to review the "About the Developer" section. This gives you information about other apps the developer has published. If available, visit the developer's website and assess its content for things like history, professional appearance, etc.

Apps that purport to allow access to military or government sites should only be installed if they are official apps and downloaded through official channels.

Perusing user ratings and reviews gives you a sense of the veracity of the application's claims.

Inarguably, no app is completely perfect for all users, but complaints about security concerns should quickly stand out from other relatively benign issues.

If you're unsure and inadvertently download an app, inspect your device's application permissions screen to determine what other applications or information will be accessed by the app. A video game, for example, is unlikely to have a legitimate need to access your contacts.

School lunch prices increase

Starting Aug: School lunch prices) will increase because of rising operational costs and to comply with federal law. The new increase is \$0.10 per full price for elementary students' meals, making their new prices \$2.50 and a \$0.20 increase for secondary students, making their meals \$2.75 for the 2016 - 2017 school year. The last price increase was \$0.35 per meal in 2012. Families qualifying for the Free and Reduced Meal Program will not have an increase in the cost of their meals. Per federal guidelines, the cost of a reduced-price meal will remain \$0.40 per meal. The Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act (Public Law 111-296) requires DoDEA schools, as participants in the USDA meal program, to raise paid student lunch prices to a level comparable to the rates used for USDA reimbursement. To meet this requirement, prices in the OCONUS schools will be gradually increased over the coming years. As the designated School Food Authority, the Army & Air Force Exchange Service provides schools meals on a nonprofit, break-even basis, for the DoD School Meal Programs (SMPs). The SMP meets the same USDA guidelines as schools in the continental United States by providing meals that have the required nutrients for children. Food, clothes, toys OK as donations in Germany

American military communities throughout Europe have done great work in providing clothing and other aid to refugees flooding to the continent in the greatest number since the end of World War II. Around one million asylum-seekers fleeing Syria, Iraq and other countries filtered into Germany by the end of last year, according to Stars and Stripes. However, U.S. Forces personnel in Germany must remember that the items they buy at the commissary or post and base exchange are generally tax and duty-free, said Tim Sellman, acting director of the USAREUR Customs Executive Agency in Wiesbaden, which is responsible for custom enforcement in Germany. The same may apply to the household goods they imported when they moved to Germany or any other item purchased tax or duty-free while stationed in Germany. Therefore, giving used personal belongings or items bought at U.S. Forces sales facilities to people who are not eligible for customs exemption under the NATO Status of Forces Agreement for Germany is subject to certain restrictions. But customs experts say U.S. Forces personnel and organizations in Germany can donate foodstuffs, clothing and children's toys to refugees without any restrictions based on an exception granted by German customs authorities. Foodstuffs, clothing and children's toys can be donated either directly to a refugee or to organizations which collect items for refugees, such as the Red Cross, without the requirement to effect customs clearance, explained Rula Strumpen, who leads the Executive Agency's NATO SOFA Office. Coordination with German Customs or U.S. military customs offices is not necessary as no taxes would need to be paid, she added. Items bought in German stores are taxed by German authorities and so can be donated to any charitable organization without restriction.
